



ABBOTSFORD HOUSE, the ancestral home of Sir Walter Scott, the 19th century novelist and poet of "Waverley", "Ivanhoe", and "Lady of the Lake". Sir Walter Scott's Abbotsford remains today as one of the most famous houses in the world, it reflects, almost as no other place, the mind, enthusiasms and preoccupations of the man who built it. Constructed on the ample proceeds of a literary career without parallel, it is an enduring monument to the tastes, talents and achievements of its begetter. The stones of Abbotsford speak eloquently both of triumph and disaster.



MELROSE, THE TWEED, THE EILDON HILLS
The three shapely summits of the Eildon Hills are perhaps the best known landmark in the Borders region. They make for a fine half-day hill walk from the attractive town of Melrose.

HOW TO GET THERE

MELROSE perhaps the most picturesque town in the Scottish Borders, is easily accessible. Edinburgh (approx. 35 miles), Glasgow and Newcastle (approx. 70 miles) are all within striking distance.

Major routes: A1, A68, A7.

ABBOTSFORD is only an hour south of Edinburgh by train or car, close to Melrose.

By car

The postcode is TD6 9BQ for Sat. Nav. directions. **Train services** from Edinburgh Waverley to Tweedbank, roughly a mile from Abbotsford, run seven days a week and take just under an hour. Both, Tweedbank Station as well as the earlier stop at Galashiels Interchange, are served by the 'Border Weaver' bus service, taking only minutes and dropping off outside the Visitor Centre.

Alternative bus services stop at the Tweedbank roundabout, a short stroll from Abbotsford.

Bus services run from Edinburgh to Carlisle via Galashiels, taking just under 1.5 hours. Visitors can transfer to local buses as well as the 'Border Weaver' service at Galashiels Bus Station. Several local bus routes stop at Galafoot Bridge, 10 minutes walking distance via a public footpath to Abbotsford.

Walking and cycle routes are easy alternatives, with the walk from Tweedbank Station taking only 20 minutes. For a scenic riverside walk, you can take the Borders Abbeys Way.

The SFO organ recital will be given by the renowned recitalist Paul Stubbings, Director of Music of St Mary's Music School in Edinburgh.

I look forward to welcoming you to the Borders in May.
